The School of Education and Behavioral Sciences offers four options leading to the Master of Education (M.Ed.). The Master of Education degree program is principally designed for individuals who are already certified or who are certifiable. This program seeks students wanting to enhance their professional competencies in the area of teaching endorsement for which certification is available at the graduate level. A minimum of 36 credit hours in approved graduate courses is required. The requirements include four components: the core curriculum; area of concentration, electives, and thesis.
