Admission Requirements

- Must be at least 21 years of age
- Must not have been enrolled full-time for at least 1 year
- Must have completed at least 60 hours of college credits
- Must have minimum 2.0 GPA in past college course work
- Must have completed general education requirements as defined by institution admitting the student

Graduation Requirements

- 2.0 GPA
- 60 credits at 4-year institution (excluding PE activity courses)
- 40 hours upper division (3/4000 level) course work (excluding PE activity courses)
- 30 hours of residency at degree granting institution
- 15 of final 30 hours or ½ of major from institution granting degree
- Must complete sufficient elective credit hours to meet 124 hours required for graduation
